

## SCHOOL SAFETY: How can our community help fight bullying?

Safe schools exist in safe communities. As community members, we can take steps to ensure that our children know that bullying and violence are not tolerated. We can teach and model the following:

- ◇ Refusing to tolerate bullying behavior or actions wherever you are.
- ◇ Reporting suspicious actions or talking to teachers or administrators at school.
- ◇ Setting clear expectations in your workplace, making clear that certain behaviors will not be tolerated, and addressing consequences for actions.
- ◇ Demonstrating respect, tolerance, and acceptance through your everyday actions and behaviors.
- ◇ Modeling appropriate behavior through volunteering within your schools and community.
- ◇ If you are able, partnering your business with your local schools in ways that benefit both entities. This might include school carnivals, incentives for students, or partnering employees as tutors or mentors for students.



According to a 2007 report published by the Bureau of Justice Statistics and the National Center for Educational Statistics:

*In 2005-06, 24 percent of public schools reported that student bullying was a daily or weekly problem.*

*In 2005, 10 percent of male students and 6 percent of female students in grades 9-12 reported being threatened or injured with a weapon on school property within the last year.*

*In 2005-06, 78 percent of schools experienced one or more incidents of violent crime.*
